The Ferns Primary Academy Year 3 Autumn Term Curriculum

What will we be learning this term?

English

Quality Texts : 'Theseus and the Minotaur ' and 'George's Marvelous Medicine'.

Autumn 1

We will be looking at a range of Greek myths and exploring how stories are written at KS2, as well as looking at writing different genres to entice the reader.

Autumn 2

We will be exploring stories written by Roald Dahl and joining in a Reading competition with other schools in the area.

Maths

This term, the main focus for children will be the development of their skills in number and calculation. For Year 3, we will :

- Read and write numbers to at least 1000 in numerals and in words.
- Recognise the place value of each digit in a three-digit number.
- Partition numbers in different ways.
- Compare and order numbers up to 1000.

Science

Enquiry Questions:

Who has the sharpest teeth, Theseus or the Minotaur?

How would George's medicine affect materials?

We will be looking at the properties of teeth and why certain teeth are chosen to do different jobs.

Also, we will look at how materials react to other materials and how their properties affect the job they do.

RE

Enquiry Question: *Who are the key figures in religion?*

We will be looking at Christianity, Islam, Sikhism and Judaism

Computing

E-Safety - *What keeps us safe on the internet?*

Information Technology - The world is full of networks. What are they and how do they work?



Topic

Enquiry Question: *Has Greeks always been in the news?*

Within our linked History and Geography work this term, the children will study Ancient Greece and explore the impact it has had on the modern world that we live in.

We will look at Greek art and in particular Grecian Urns. What does there decoration urns tell us? The children will create their own using air drying clay and decorating them using various paints.
