What will we be learning this term?

English

Quality Texts : 'The Piano' and 'Rose Blanche'. We will be looking at a range of different genres within our English lessons and using I pads and laptops to publish our work.

Maths

This term, the main focus for children will be the development of their skills in a range of reasoning calculation skills. For Year 6, this will include:

Science

Enquiry Questions: *Can We Light UP Anderson Shelters?*

These two units will look at the theme of electricity. Children will learn to analyse and construct electrical circuits in order to recognise how electricity works and whether we could have lit up an Anderson shelter in World War II.

RE

Enquiry Question: *Are we team players?*

This term we will be looking at how we can function correctly as part of a team by modelling the right behaviour to others in order to strengthen our relationships. .

Topic

Enquiry Question: How did the World Wars affect life in Europe?

Within our linked history and geography work this term, children will study World War II and in particular what affect it had on European society. We would be analysing the key events of World War II, including studying extensively the events that led up to the war to understand the geographical and

historical

impact of one of the most famous periods of time in the 20th century.
